In 1959 we visited people who lived on a lake in southern Michigan. There were lots of lakes in the area and there were lots of pontoon rafts on the lakes. At that time there was none on the Ohio River.

We thought that would be a great way to boat on the river. At that time I was working at Mesker Steel Co so I made some drawings and had the shop make the pontoons. Also included was a way to swing the wheels up under the deck and also telescoping tongue that went back under the deck. This way we had no trailer to fool with.

We put on a plywood deck that was painted with non slip paint, and an old 15 hp Evinrude outboard motor. We had it on the water before 1959 was over.



This is 1960 Camping on Sled Creek, Kentucky Lake, the pontoon raft on the water, our tent and a Ken Vogel's tent.

This was in a primitive area there was no road access. We had to bring everything in to camp on the pontoon. That is Paula, Karen, John and Vicki standing in the water by the pontoon.

We would usually launch at the Grand Rivers ramp and cross the lake when we went to Sled Creek.



This picture you can see the telescoping tongue. Shown here it is retracted under the deck.

All the metal was painted with bright yellow RustOleum. The wood deck was white.

It was 8' wide and the pontoons were 23' long. The deck was 8' x 16'.

The rail was ³/₄ pipes with ¹/₄ ropes between the top and bottom rails.



At this time we had a 1955 Ford 6 cylinder auto. It had no trouble pulling the pontoon at highway speed or pulling it up the ramp.

Note; there were no interstates at that time between Evansville and the lake, all state roads.












