PENNY GLACKMAN TAKES NATIONAL HONOR

Penny Glackman, 3rd grade teacher at Merion, has been named to the board of Advisors of the Coalition for space Exploration, a national group aimed at educating and informing people about the value of exploring space. Glackman joins a renowned group of board members that includes Apollo astronaut Buzz Aldrin who walked on the moon in 1969 with Neil Armstrong. Also, James

Cameron, the Academy-Award winning movie director, serves on the board. (His movies include Titanic, The Terminator, and Aliens).

Glackman learned of the honor late last spring, and until recently, could be seen on the district website (www.lmsd.org) in a photo with Buzz Aldrin. A story also appeared. Glackman and a middle school science teacher in Colorado are the first two educators to be appointed to the board. The Coalition for Space Exploration, a collaboration of space industry and advocacy groups, announced her selection at the National Science Teachers Association National Conference in St. Louis, MO.

Glackman said she did not realize what an honor it was to be appointed until she received the phone call from the board, letting her know she'd been selected. Her work on the board will include education outreach, and encouraging an understanding of space exploration – “its importance and its excitement, and its impact upon our world,” Glackman said. Throughout her 17 years at Merion School Glackman’s passion for space has been evident. She began actively bringing space into the classroom in 1997 after participating in NASA’s Educational Workshop for Elementary School Teachers program at the Kennedy Space Center. Since then, she has participated in a variety of NASA programs and workshops.

She received a Special Award for Excellence from the National Space Society in recognition of her lobbying the state of Pennsylvania to support space exploration. Joe Mayer, the chair of the Coalition’s public affairs team, said in the school district’s website article that Glackman would “add depth” to the coalition’s mission. “We will look to her for classroom methods to bring space down to earth, in order to encourage younger generations to excel in math, science and technology, preparing them for careers in the space industry,” Mayer said.
