This year **Anne (Germano) McKeeby** will celebrate her 102nd birthday. She was born in Evansville, Indiana on April 18, 1908, the youngest of seven children born of Albert E. and Kathryn Swope.

While attending Ohio State University, she met and married Guy G. Germano. When World War II broke out, the couple moved with their 2 young children, Gyanne and Don, to Florida where Guy was assigned as Red Cross Field Director at Buckingham Army Airfield in Fort Myers, Florida.

At the end of the war, the family moved to Georgia, where Anne and Guy both took up teaching jobs and remained outside Atlanta, where the children grew up.

Several years after Guy died in 1972 at the age of 65, Anne remarried a family friend, Bill McKeeby, and remained living in College Park, Georgia until Bill's death some 15 years later.

After that, Anne moved to Christian City, an assistant living facility, where she remains today. Anne continues to be fairly active and goes on her own to the facility's dinning area for her meals. She continues to handle her own financial and business affairs, and pays her own bills. She is a remarkable woman!

As a retired high school teacher, Anne still enjoys reading classic and current novels, as well as writing poetry. She also likes watching the news and keeps up with all the current events and politics.

Anne regularly goes out to eat wither son, Don, and his wife, Sara Mac, who live nearby, but she also likes going out to Thai and Chinese restaurants, and eating southern barbeque.

She celebrated Easter at Don's home together with Sara Mac and 2 great grandchildren.

Anne looks forward to visits with daughter, Gyanne, and her husband, Charles, who live in Jacksonville, Florida, when they can come up.

Don and Sara's son, Brian, a Methodist minister, and his wife, Trish, and their 16 year old daughter, Jennifer, live north of Atlanta about an hour from Anne.
