Merion teacher takes PA to the "final frontier"

Merion teacher Penny Glackman recently recieved a Special Award for Excellence from the National Space Society in recognition of her pioneering efforts to support space exploration. Apollo 11 Astronaut Buzz Aldrin (pictured) congratulated Glackman on her award during a May 19 ceremony in Washington, held in

conjunction with the International Space Development Conference.

In August 2005, Glackman answered the call of NSS to assist in lobbying the state of PA to pass a resolution in support of space exploration. NSS officials believe that if every state passes such resolutions, the collective movement will impact upon the legislators in Washington, D.C. Glackman contacted elected officials in Harrisburg, including local representative Daylin Leach,(149th district) and State Senator Connie Williams (District 17), who provided enthusiastic support in introducing a new resolution for Pennsylvania.

Glackman, who has a long history of and commitment to educating youth about space science and exploration, helped craft the language used in Resolution #842, introduced by Rep. Leach and passed by the PA House of Representatives on October 4, 2004 (the 47th anniversary of Sputnik, the first man-made satellite to orbit the Earth). On November 15, 2004, the PA Senate passed resolution #314.
